The new Royal Princess is a gem of a ship, providing a wonderful and intimate ambience for visiting the world's fascinating destinations. Onboard, you'll delight in many of the trademark features you've come to know on other Princess ships - ScholarShip@Sea courses, fresh-water swimming pools, exciting nightspots and production shows. But she also boasts her own unique attributes, including fine wood paneling and leather armchairs, a library with over 4,000 titles - one of the best-stocked at sea - al fresco dining on deck and more. And three-quarters of her 355 staterooms offer the extraordinary vantage of your own balcony!

Day 1 - Hometown/Fort Lauderdale. Upon arrival, board the *Royal Princess* for 5:00PM departure. (D)

Day 2 - At Sea

Participate in your choice of on-board activities: browse the world-class art collection, shop in duty-free boutiques, relax in a hot tub, sun yourself on the deck with a book from the ship's library, exercise in a state-of-the-art gym, or pamper yourself in the spa; and at mealtimes take advantage of the ship's variety of dining options. Day 3 - At Sea. On-board activities. (B,L,D)

Day 4 - St. Barthelemy, 9:00 a.m./5:00 p.m.

Tiny, picture-perfect St. Barts has long been the haunt of the very rich who come for privacy, gorgeous beaches, and exquisite French cuisine. It has 20 or more magnificent beaches, linked by hilly narrow roads you can explore in open-air Jeeps or "mini-mokes." In Gustavia, the island's Lilliputian port, quaint streets lead past small markets, bakeries, and dozens of small shops selling French perfumes, sportswear, watches, and crystal. (B,L,D)

Day 5 - St. Lucia, 9:00 a.m./6:00 p.m.

This lovely island offers something for everyone. Nature lovers can join a whale-watching cruise or kayak to Pigeon Island. Golfers can tee off on a course with panoramic views of the Caribbean and the Atlantic. There are 10 miles of jungle trails for biking; and for romantics, there's a guided horseback ride to a secluded beach. (B,L,D)

Day 6 - Scarborough, Trinidad, 9:00 a.m./5:00 p.m.

You don't have to go to Scotland to play golf at St. Andrews; there's a course by that name right here on the island. And you don't have to travel during Carnival time to experience the celebration with a cultural show performed here, where the tradition began. (B,L,D)

Day 7 - At Sea. On-board activities. (B,L,D)

Day 8 - Devil's Island, French Guiana (Isle Royale), 1:00 p.m./6:00 p.m.

It was next to impossible to escape this penal colony - made famous in the book *Papillon* - but you can visit with our "get out of jail free" ticket. (B,L,D)

Day 9 - At Sea. On-board activities. (B,L,D)

Day 11 - Santarem, Brazil, 9:00 a.m./7:00 p.m.

Experience the legendary “meeting of the waters” as you cruise the Amazon on a riverboat excursion. You may choose to visit the Joao Fona Cultural Center, which features a superb collection of pre-Columbian pottery and ceramics, as well as paintings and furniture from Santarem’s early days. Or, meet with a family to learn the ways of Brazil. Watch them prepare manioc flour, an Amazonian staple; take in a demonstration of the traditional way to extract latex from a rubber tree; and see a display of the implements used by 19th-century rubber collectors. (B,L,D)

Day 12 - Boca da Valeria (Amazon River), Brazil, 10:00 a.m./5:00 p.m.

The grass huts, log canoes, and gentle lifestyle of the remarkable river people of the Amazon River are unforgettable to see and experience. Set on a bend in the mighty river, this quiet Amazon village is a trading point for those living on the banks. The locals will happily sell you a few trinkets at a good price. (B,L,D)

Day 13 - Parintins, Brazil, 7:00 a.m./5:00 p.m.

Cathedrals and churches play a prominent role in the cityscape of Parintins, reflective of the importance of faith in the citizens’ lives. The scale is appropriate to a central Amazon River town of only 50,000—much smaller than the nearby state capital of Manaus. Accessible only by air or water, this isolated village offers passengers a true insight into jungle cultures that have remained unchanged for centuries. (B,L,D)

Day 14 - Manaus, Brazil, 10:00 a.m.

This Brazilian city offers rugged adventures, from hunting alligators by flashlight to taking a guided jungle trek. You may decide to take a river boat cruise up the Rio Negro to the “Meeting of the Waters” where the Amazon is born. Visit an Amazonian village for a close-up look at the rustic life lived by the Amazon’s hardy river people, and then journey deep into the flooded forest, plus walk on an elevated walkway to see the giant water lilies at Lake January. Or, take in the city’s historic sights. Visit the magnificently restored Neo-classical Opera House, the Military Zoo devoted to the wildlife of the Amazon, and the Indian Museum with its displays of blowguns, feather headdresses, and ceremonial objects. (B)

Day 15 - Manaus, Brazil//Hometown - This morning we are transferred to the airport for our return flight to the States.

Terms and Conditions

PAYMENT: A deposit is required for booking. Full payment is due approximately 80 days prior to departure.

AIR TRANSPORTATION: Cruise price. Princess Cruise Lines offers low air fare add-ons from most major U.S. cities. Dehoney Travel will compare this with other options to ensure the lowest possible travel rate. Air taxes vary depending on departure city and are subject to change.

NOT INCLUDED IN CRUISE PRICE: Air fare & taxes; government fees & transfers; gratuities (\$10 per day, billed to cabin); Single supplement; excess baggage and forwarding of baggage; travel protection plan; passports; personal items such as laundry or tips for personal favors; any costs resulting from absence or deviation from the itinerary; meals not listed as being included; items of a personal nature; and any items not shown herein as being included.

CANCELLATION: In event of cancellation, there will be fees of \$75 for Dehoney Travel, Inc. to cover administrative costs. In addition, without protection as outlined below, cancellation fees will be charged by Princess Cruise Lines. Cancellation penalties are as follows: after booking-80 days prior to tour, only the \$75 administrative fee; 79-62 days prior to departure will be charged the amount of deposit. Within 61-34 days prior, 50% of the total tour cost (including air add-on and taxes) will be assessed. Within 33-20 days prior, 75% of the total tour cost (including air add-on and taxes) will be assessed. Within 19 days to tour departure, total tour cost (including air add-on and taxes) is non-refundable. Any trip interruption due to illness, accident or family emergency is subject to 100% of the unused balance of the total tour cost. **Cancellation notifications must be made in writing to Dehoney Travel. Please allow up to 4 weeks for cancellation refund processing.**

Princess Cruises reserves the right to cancel any scheduled tour prior to departure. In the event that this should occur after final payment has been received by Princess Cruises, all payment will be refunded in full. Princess Cruises reserves the right to use alternate means of transportation when tour passenger numbers warrant such substitution and also reserves the right to change show performances when not available.

CANCELLATION, AIR TICKETS: Airfare and air taxes are 100% non-refundable once tickets are issued.

TRAVEL PROTECTION PLAN: As many U.S. health carriers do not provide benefits while outside the country and cancellation penalties can be substantial for many tours, Dehoney Travel recommends the purchase of Princess Travel Protection. In order to maximize the value of your coverage, we recommend this purchase be made at time of deposit. **You may decline**

the Travel Protection Plan, but a signed disclaimer is required and all cancellation charges are your responsibility.

CHANGES: A \$50 service fee will be charged for changes made to existing tours within 45 days of departure. Changes of departure date or tour are considered a cancellation and a new booking. Additional charges may be assessed for changes to air tickets or air reservations. The service fee will not be assessed when upgrading cruise accommodations.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTATION: A current passport is required for this cruise.
