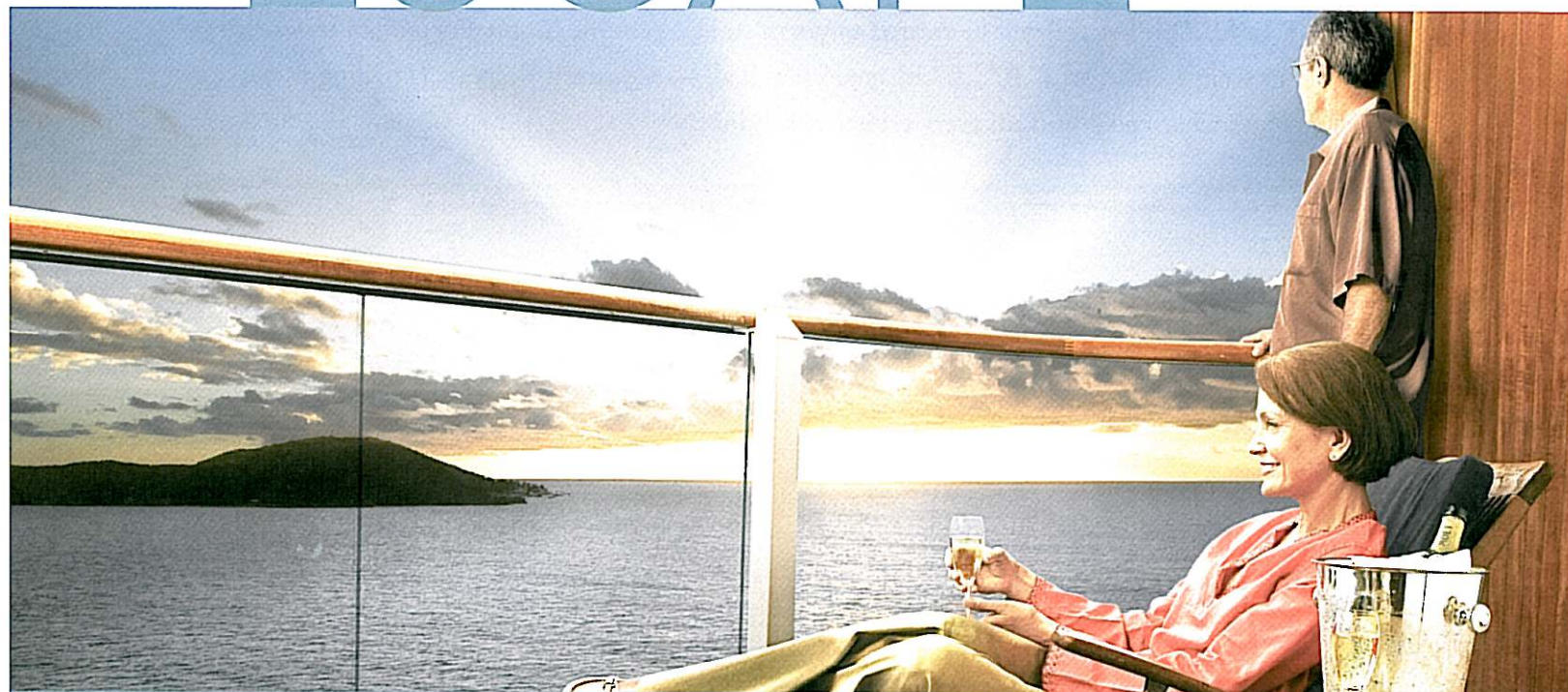

*Autumn is glorious in Canada and New England - - especially when you travel there onboard the Emerald Princess. The sun shines on the Eastern Seaboard's many seafaring towns, and in the evening the cool fall air works its magic on the leaves of the trees. If your timing is just right, you'll be treated to a dazzling show of crimson and gold foliage.*

**Day 1 - Hometown/New York City. Board ship and depart PM.**

Fly from your hometown to New York to board the *Emerald Princess*. Sail this evening.

**Day 2 - Newport, Rhode Island, 7:00 a.m./4:00 p.m.**

Explore Newport's nature trails, natural harbor, boutiques and rustic beaches by enjoying a walk or bike ride along the Cliff Walk and Ocean Drive. This charming Rhode Island city is known for its mansions, including Rosecliff, The Elms and Marble House. Newport boasts an old colonial section with many authentic and restored buildings, such as the White Horse Tavern and Friends Meeting House. See Trinity Church, Redwood Library, and the Gothic Church of Saint Mary's, where Jacqueline Bouvier wed Senator John F. Kennedy. Drive down Bellevue Avenue, where society's millionaires built their fabulous "summer cottages," many beautifully preserved by the Newport Preservation Society.

**Day 3 - Boston, Massachusetts, 10:00 a.m./7:00 p.m.**

In this city full of ghosts of America's beginnings, follow the Freedom Trail, passing King's Chapel, its Burial Ground, and the Old South Meeting House where the Boston Tea Party began. Continue past the Old State House and the site of the Boston Massacre. See the balcony from which the Declaration of Independence was read on July 18, 1776. You may choose to take an excursion following the route of Paul Revere's midnight ride and visiting the famous North Bridge, where "the shot heard 'round the world" began the American Revolution; or to Salem Village to visit its museum and to view dramatic presentations about the 17th-century Witchcraft Trials.

**Day 4 - Bar Harbor, Maine, 7:00 a.m./6:00 p.m.**

On the east side of Maine's Mt. Desert Island and surrounded by Acadia National Park, Bar Harbor is a beautiful coastal paradise, referred to by many as the most beautiful spot in North America. Enjoy a scenic drive to Cadillac Mountain or participate in a whale-watching excursion. Take some time to travel to Acadia National Park, passing sights along the way such as Jordan Pond House, Otter Cliffs and Thunder Hole. Most of the park was donated by the Rockefeller family, and you see hand-cut stone bridges and other evidence of the family's elaborate carriage trails as you travel through the park. You may want to finish the day with a feast of lobster at the elegant Asticou Inn.

**Day 5 - Saint John, New Brunswick, 7:00 a.m./2:00 p.m.**

Saint John's history begins in 1604, when Champlain landed near the present-day city on the feast day of Saint John the Baptist. Explore this historic city and watch the tides of the Bay of Fundy actually make the Saint John river flow upstream. Enjoy visiting the oldest farmer's market in Canada. The shipwrights who built the market gave it a crowning touch: a roof in the shape of a ship's hull. You may choose to take a jet boat ride through the Reversing Rapids on the Saint John River, or visit the picturesque fishing village of Saint Andrew's-by-the-Sea. Just off the New Brunswick coast is a rich ecosystem featuring whales, dolphins and herds of seals.

**Day 6 - Halifax, Nova Scotia, 9:00 a.m./6:00 p.m.**

The capital of beautiful Nova Scotia, Halifax has a picturesque harbor and some of Canada's friendliest people. The Maritime Museum, located on the waterfront, is dedicated to preserving the Atlantic Province's marine history, and its collection of marine artifacts is one of the largest in Canada. Halifax Citadel National Park was completed in 1828 and served Britain as the bastion of imperial control in North America for more than 75 years. The fort boasts impressive stone ramparts, cannons and panoramic harbor views. Also, make sure to save time for a visit to Peggy's Cove, home of the world's most photographed lighthouse.

**Day 7 - Sydney, Nova Scotia, 9:00 a.m./6:00 p.m.**

The city of Sydney has a deep history and was originally founded in 1785 by British Loyalists fleeing the perils of the Ameri-



can Revolution. The rich natural resources led these new settlers to establish prosperous coal and steel industries, which attracted immigrants from a myriad of ethnic and cultural backgrounds. To this day, Sydney remains a haven of multiculturalism. Cape Breton is fabled as a magical travel destination and the Port of Sydney is the gateway. Known for its beauty and unique Celtic music and culture, Sydney puts some of the Island's greatest sights and attractions at your fingertips. (B,L,D)

**Day 8 - Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, 8:00 a.m./5:00 p.m.**

Prince Edward Island's landscape is dramatic and features rolling hills, pristine forests, reddish-white sand beaches, ocean coves and the famous red soil. The capital of Charlottetown has evolved into a dynamic city without sacrificing its historic charm. One certainly cannot think about Prince Edward without mentioning the author Lucy Maud Montgomery who once lived on PEI and drew inspiration from the land during the late Victorian Era for the setting of her classic novel "Anne of Green Gables." PEI also has another claim to fame with the Confederation Bridge built in 1997. The world's longest bridge over ice-covered waters provides a connection from PEI to the mainland Canada. (B,L,D)

**Day 9 - At Sea**

Participate in your choice of on-board activities: browse the world-class art collection, shop in duty-free boutiques, relax in a hot tub, sun yourself on the deck with a book from the ship's library, exercise in a state-of-the-art gym, or pamper yourself in the spa; and at mealtimes take advantage of the ship's variety of dining options. (B,L,D)

**Day 10 - Quebec City, Quebec, arrive 7:00 a.m.**

To visit Québec is to experience France without crossing the Atlantic. The architecture, the ambience, and the animated conversation on the street confirm the impression that a bit of France has been permanently imbedded in North America. Stroll along the streets of the atmospheric Latin Quarter and explore the historic stone and brick houses of Old Québec, the only remaining walled city north of Mexico. Visit the Place Royale and Notre Dame des Victoires, the oldest stone church in North America, and marvel at the turreted Château de Frontenac. (B,L,D)

**Day 11 - Quebec City, Quebec, disembark AM**

We disembark this morning and transfer to the airport for our return flight home. (B)

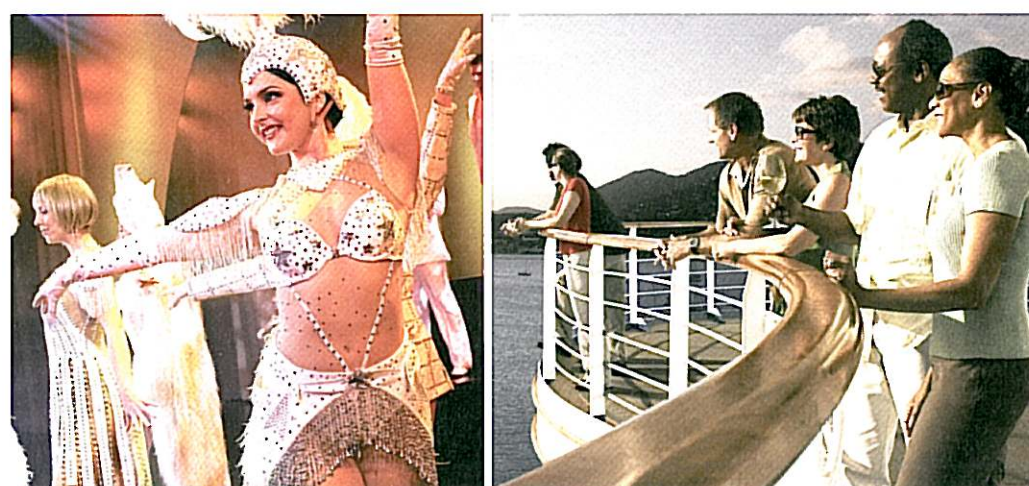

## Terms and Conditions

**PAYMENT:** A deposit of \$700 per person is required for booking. Full payment is due upon receipt of final invoice, approximately 12 weeks prior to departure.

**AIR ARRANGEMENTS:** Princess Cruise Lines offers low air fare add-ons from most major U.S. cities. Please contact our office for airfare quote from your hometown to New York and back from Quebec City. Air taxes are dependent on departure city and subject to change prior to departure.

**DINING:** First seating is requested for all passengers unless Dehoney Travel, Inc. is notified to the contrary. Because Princess processes dining requests in the order in which they are received, dining requests are not guaranteed. All meals aboard ship are included.

**NOT INCLUDED IN CRUISE PRICE:** Airfare & applicable air taxes; transfers (\$53); government fees (\$130); gratuities (approximately \$11.50 per day for cruise collected on board ship); Travel Protection Plan; items of a personal nature; and any other item not specifically listed as being included.

**TRAVEL DOCUMENTATION:** A current passport is required for this cruise.

**CHANGES:** A \$100 service fee will be charged for changes made to existing tours within 45 days of departure. Changes of departure date or tour are considered a cancellation and a new booking. The service fee will not be assessed when upgrading cruise accommodations.

**CANCELLATION:** In event of cancellation, there will be fees of \$100 for Dehoney Travel, Inc. to cover administrative costs. In addition, without protection as outlined below, cancellations made from 95-80 days prior to departure will be charged the amount of \$250. Within 79-62 days prior to departure, \$500. Within 61-34 days prior, 50% of the total tour cost, (including air add-on and tax) will be assessed. Within 33-20 days prior, 75% of the total tour cost, (including air add-on and tax) will be assessed; within 19 days to day of departure/no show, entire tour cost is non-refundable. Any trip interruption due to illness, accident or family emergency is subject to 100% of the unused balance of the total tour cost. **Please allow up to four weeks for cancellation refund processing.**

**AIR TICKETS:** Air tickets will be subject to cancellation/re-booking penalties. The cost of any cancellation or changes made once the ticket has been issued will be charged to the passenger. Special requests are subject to a deviation fee by the air department. **After ticketing of international air, a cancellation penalty of 100% of the air fare is in effect. On or after the date of departure there can be no refund for any service not used.**

Princess Tours reserves the right to cancel any scheduled tour prior to departure. In the event that this should occur after final payment has been received by Princess Tours, all payments will be refunded in full. Princess Tours reserves the right to use alternate means of transportation when tour passenger numbers warrant such substitution and also reserves the right to change show performances when not available.
